# Did you know that we have a School Based Heath Center at Dr. Freddie Thomas Learning Center?

#### What is School Based Health Care (SBHC)?

SBHC is providing medical and mental health services at the school, so that care is within easy access to students who may need it. The SBHC staff work closely with your doctor in the community so that you can have the best possible, immediate care.

#### Who can join?

The SBHC are available to all students in the school. Students must have permission from a parent or guardian to enroll in these services.

#### How do I sign up?

Enrollment forms are located in the SBHC at the school. It only takes a few minutes to fill out the forms.

#### How much does it cost?

There is no direct cost to the student or family. Costs are covered by your health insurance, the New York State Health Department and Federal grants.

#### **Staffing Information:**

The SBHC is staffed by caring Nurse Practitioners, Mental Health Therapist, Developmental Pediatrician, Medical Office Assistant, Pediatricians, Psychiatrist, Psychologist, School Health Aide and School Nurse.

#### Our goal:

Our goal is to provide health services to the students in our schools to keep them healthy both physically and emotionally.

#### Our Pledge:

We believe that families are vital to the health and well -being of our students. We will respect the legal rights of the students and family to keep all information private. We will work hard to encourage parents and students to strengthen their connections with each other and to communicate effectively with each other. We believe that individuals and families having health care in our community is vital to their long-term health and well-being. To that end, we will help our students and their families find health care in our community and when needed, will help them find affordable health insurance.

#### **Primary and Lower Elementary**

Over the past three weeks, our youngest students worked on cooperation. During our "Cooperative Theme", students learned the word "cooperation" as helping others and working together. They applied the meaning of cooperation in games and activities. All these games were non-competitive and gave an opportunity for students to rely on other classmates. Doing so, would allow them to complete a task. Some of the games we engaged in were the inchworm, ROCK, cooperative hula hoops and quack escape. ### Middle and Upper Elementary

Our students recently completed the second rotation in the pool. The second rotation introduced students to basic swimming skills



essential for learning how to swim. We covered the proper way to enter the pool using jumping and cork screw techniques. While in the water, students learned how to perform bobbers. Students also explored how to execute the front and back float as well as why it is important to use these techniques when tired. Although the unit focused on basic swimming skills, experienced swimmers still continued to work to better refine these skills. Most importantly, experienced swimmers were used as demonstrators and served as peerteachers for beginner swimmers.

Our next skill themes or units will take place in the gymnasium. We will be working on volleyball and basketball. Stay tuned:)

Montessori Academy's new Instrumental Music Program got off to a great start in December. The beautiful sound of toots, rat-a-tats and honks (and an occasional squeak!) from Montessori's twenty-five, beginning instrumental students can now be heard every A and C Day afternoon in the music room.

On their first day, clarinet, flute, saxophone and trumpet students learned about

their mouthpiece and how to make a sound on it. This first lesson was a challenge for many of them, but no one gave up.



At the second lesson, these same students learned to carefully put their instruments together and where toplace their hands. They also had their first experience blowing through their instrument with the mouthpiece on it. Students were thrilled for themselves and each other when they realized they were (all) able to produce a real sound. Lesson books with practice assignments were sent home with students.

At the first lesson, percussion students learned the proper way to hold their sticks. They were a bit surprised to learn that, when it comes to performing sticking patterns, it's all in the wrists — not in the arms, like they first thought!

At the second lesson, these students were given their lesson books and introduced to the art of reading percussion music. Together, they read and played through the first page of their book, encouraging each other along the way.
