Xylophone

This song will help you and your children remember some of the basic rules and techniques for playing the xylophone. Use the picture as a visual cue for the children to get their bodies into the proper position. Their elbows should be raised slightly as if "riding a bicycle," and the fist should be loose when holding the mallet. The xylophone can be placed on a carpeted area, with the child kneeling in front of it. The longer bars (lower sounds) should be on the child's left. If you have a short table to place it on where children don't have to reach up to play it, you can change the first line to, "Standing up tall to play the xylophone."

In pre-school, <u>only</u> adults should remove and replace bars, and it is advisable (especially in the beginning) to do this before the children arrive, rather than in front of them. Most pre-k children need frequent reminders not to take bars off, such as, "Only the grown-ups touch the bars." Adults should lift the bars straight upward off the pegs, using two hands, one on each end of the bar.

For this song, take off all of the F, and B bars, and if you wish, D bars as well. You can move the remaining bars together so that there are no spaces in between (see picture on right) or leave them as they are. The xylophone can be used in this configuration to accompany many Pre-K songs (you can print the list on the last page).
