# Advanced Course Access Advocates

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### **ICE BREAKER: TWO TRUTHS AND A LIE!**

A student can earn college credit while in high school. AP classes are ONLY for students who get all A's. A student can request to take virtual AP & dual credit courses during the year.

## Advanced Placement (AP) vs Dual Credit (DC)

Advanced Placement

- High classes with college-level curricula created by the College Board
- Culminate with an AP Exam created by College Board in May
- College credit awarded based on AP Exam Score
- RCSD pays for AP Exam Registration Fees





- Students are dual enrolled in course at their high school and at a partnered college RIT Potsdam ESF
  Student takes course at their high
- Student takes course at their high school to earn both high school and college credit
- College credit awarded based on course grade (usually C+ or better)
- RCSD pays tuition for the dual enrollment



### Why Choose Advanced Placement Courses?

- Increases college readiness skills: students that have exposure to AP courses fare better academically in high school and college.
- Exposure to AP courses helps with both subject <u>understanding</u> and study habits.
- Students that take AP courses are more likely to be engaged in school, have <u>fewer absences, suspensions and higher graduation</u> <u>rates.</u>

## The Power of a 1 or a 2


New evidence now shows there are benefits to taking AP courses even for students who don't earn a qualifying score.



#### $\mathbf{\hat{n}}$ CollegeBoard

College Enrollment: AP students who earn a score of 1 or 2, or average a score of 1 or 2 across their AP Exams in high school, have better college outcomes than academically similar college students who did not take an AP course and exam
