
WHAT YOU WILL NEED EVERY DAY


Each student will need to bring the following to class every day:


- 1) a notebook (single subject)

- 3) a homework folder (provided by your teachers)


The folder will be for English class only. You will carry your homework assignments in it back and forth to school. In addition, we will keep another folder in the classroom with the classwork we are working on currently, so you will be able to access it easily on a daily basis. Students will receive a cumulative writing folder that will be kept in the classroom. These folders will contain all of your formal writing assignments throughout the year. During the course of the year, scholars will return to certain works they produced earlier and make efforts to revise and improve them. Students will receive the folder to take home at the end of the year, but parents are welcome to check your folder at any time.

HOMEWORK AND HELP

Homework will be assigned regularly. You will often be assigned learning activities that will continue work begun in class and will help us to assess how well you are progressing. We will also ask your parents to check to make sure you complete it every night. We try to make sure that homework assignments are not too long, and if you have worked for 20 minutes on an assignment and still not completed it, all we ask is that you have your parent/family member write a note to inform us that you worked for 20 minutes, and that was all you were able to finish. Homework assignments are not long, but they are essential so that you can come in prepared to excel in the work of the day ahead. You can expect to work on rough draft compositions at home. Please have your parent/family member check your homework assignments for completeness.

OUR GOALS FOR STUDENTS

Our goal is to help you improve your overall reading and writing skills, to make sure you are ready for high school and for the world of college and work that lies beyond. In order to achieve this goal, the classroom norms we create together will be strictly enforced by fellow students and teachers. You will be asked to bring home a contact information sheet to your parent/family member. Please make sure they include a daytime phone number and email address in case we need to reach them at any time during the school year. You should return this form to receive your first credit for homework.
