**Clarify** – Use your common sense to sort out anything that’s confusing.

**Predict** – Guess what will happen next/

**Summarize** – Restate the “big idea”, and the key details in your own words.

**Visualize** – See the text as a movie in your head.

**Question** – Write down any questions that pop into your head.

**Remember** – If the text reminds you of anything, write it down.

**React** – Note what you feel as you read the text.

**Infer** – Combine what the text says with what you already know.

*Various strategies are incorporated within the literature pieces as help is scaffolded.*

*At Level 3 (Independent): Clicking on the Thought Bubble allows all strategies to be suggested.*
