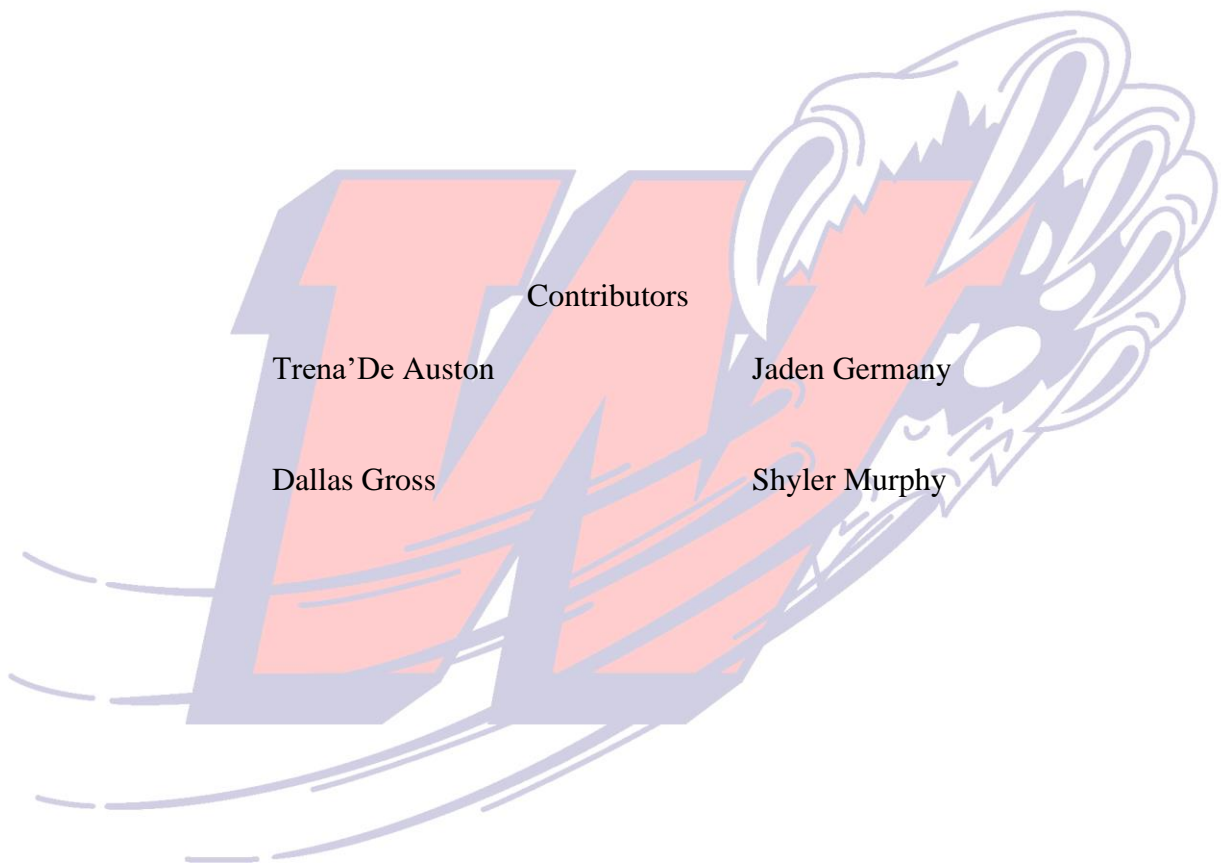




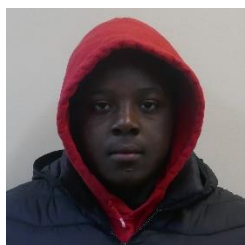

Career paths don't always end where you think they will. Dan Gross, from WROC News Channel 8, did not plan to pursue the career he has today.

Gross had an interest in music and played in school bands growing up. While he enjoyed music, he never thought of it being in the front and center of his future. Instead, he wanted to be a music journalist to stay around what his passion.

Coming on board at Channel 8, Gross hoped to just start a music segment but ended up being a jack-of-all-trades with jobs including photographer, producer and business and development reporter.

While doing his job, he enjoys meeting new people (business owners), finding it very interesting and rewarding to get to know and learn about different communities. He also enjoys the fast pace his job requires.

According to Gross, "My favorite part of the day-to-day is when I receive hot stories about exciting events and am the first person to report about them. It is an exciting feeling."

He has worked for Channel 8 for the past six-and-a-half years and has been in the business and development world for the last two.

Some of his projects aired throughout the United States and, later, worldwide.
