







DAILY5: READING TASKS AND WRITING PROMPTS

DAILY 5 READING: All grades **read 20-30 minutes** for each task **except Kdg (10 min. each)**

NOTE: Tasks can be divided up and accomplished at any time of the day.

	<p>Read to Self (Independently, except for Kdg) Primary: Select a CKLA Reader and read 1 chapter in it. Intermediate: Read/Answer questions from NYS Exams and/or read an E-book (i.e. Tumblebooks) <u>without</u> audio.</p>
	<p>Read to Buddy/Siblings Share a book (or E-book) <u>without</u> audio and each child takes turns reading a page or echo/choral reads. Intermediate students can create Literature Circles.</p>
	<p>Listen to Reading Select an E-book/audio book or family member reads <u>to</u> child.</p>
	<p>Ipads/Computer Choose any interactive game, Lexia, Dreambox Math, Zearn, RAZKids/ReadingA-Z, Starfall, BRAINPOP, Tumblebooks, etc.</p>
	<p>Writing Prompts (below)/Word Work/Skills Use Writing prompts; Use BRAINPOP, Starfall, etc to learn a new skill (i.e. idioms/clichés) OR dictionary to define any unknown words.</p>
	<p>Guided Reading (with teacher/parent) Do a picture walk (guess what's going on prior to reading,) predictions, questions, clarify, summarize</p>

NOTE: You can find the grade level writing prompt on the webpage table under WRITING.

GRADE	Directions
Kdg	Select a writing prompt, draw a picture of it, and tell us about it. Label it using one or two words.
1st	Select a writing prompt, draw a picture of it, and write 1-3 sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation.
2nd	Select a writing prompt, draw a picture of it, and write 5 or more sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation.
3rd	Select a writing prompt, draw a picture of it, and write 5-7 sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation. (You can use RACE without the C.) Restate the question (topic sentence), provide 2 or 3 details, then add a conclusion.
4th	Select a writing prompt and write 7-10 sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation. (You can use RACE without the C.) Restate the question (topic sentence), provide 2 or 3 details, then add a conclusion.
5th	Select a writing prompt and write 10-15 sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation. (You can use RACE without the C.) Perhaps this will be a short story with a beginning, middle, and end. (Introduction, 2-3 supporting paragraphs, and a conclusion)
6th	Select a writing prompt and write 10-15 sentences about it. Don't forget capital letters and punctuation. (You can use RACE without the C.) Perhaps this will be a short story with a beginning, middle, and end. (Introduction, 2-3 supporting paragraphs, and a conclusion)
