- Implementation of RCSD Curriculum
 Being a Writer has been a success although some grades are missing kits and need to share materials. Teachers have been getting books from the library. Approval of funds needed to purchase materials is what is causing the hold-up. It should be resolved within a few weeks. In the meantime, teachers should make copies using the kits available. There is at least one kit available for each grade and teachers have access to the curriculum online to print copies of workbook materials. There are questions teachers still have related to ZEARN. We can email Jeff Good to see if we can get those questions answered. Ms. Garfield suggested that teachers create a list of questions that they has ot that we can send them to Jeff Mikols or Jeff Good to create a frequently asked questions list for ZEARN.
Lesson Planning
 Some teachers are using the lesson plans provided. Some teachers are handing in lesson plans that are not reflective on what they are teaching. Each grade level band's leader should allow planning time during grade level meetings so that we are building capacity. Next grade level meetings should discuss ways grade levels can plan together.
Restorative Practices
 We have a restorative practice coach, Angelica Matias, that will work with the restorative practice team. She will meet with the team and they will get Professional Development to turnkey to the staff #44. Mrs. Laird stated that restorative practices is working great in her room. She implements circles every morning and when needed.
 Students are using the reflection sheet when they are in the reflection room. There are different shee for the primary and intermediate grades. Everyone is using the same language.

	 We will use that data from all the assessments to develop the Walk to Read program. A parent asked if a student is at a higher level, can they go to the next grade level for enrichment? Ms. Garfield stated that during Walk to Read and through differentiated instruction is when scholars will get the enrichment they need. Also, during literacy centers the groups will be tiered to meet the needs of each scholar.
