Dr. Abdul-Malik Muhammad has over 20 years serving both youth and adults. Dr. Muhammad is always working with the underserved in urban and rural areas. He has focused on the development of Black boys to men, establishing a progressive pedagogy for oppressed youth, and building progressive organizations. Dr. Muhammad also serves as Vice President of several educational, mental health and human services operations in 8 states across the U.S. Through this work, he continues to diligently work towards transforming lives, one community at a time. Dr. Muhammad is also actively involved in several national and international organizations, championing an emphasis on Black and Latino youth. Dr. Muhammad holds an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership from the University of Delaware.

Dr. Muhammad, a founding member, supports Akoben through overall leadership, administrative oversight, client interface and providing trainings, keynotes, and consultation. Dr. Muhammad holds a black belt in traditional Japanese martial arts and is an aspiring guitarist.
