

"Bullying is **deliberately** hurtful behaviour which is repeated over a period of time.


It is **difficult** for those being bullied to stop the process."

Mean, hurtful comments and spreading rumors are the most common type of cyberbullying





DIFFERENT TYPES OF CYBERBULLYING



Use of the internet, a smartphone, or other technology to harass, threaten, embarrass, or target another person.



HARASSMENT

When a builty sends offersive and malicious messages to an individual or group



OUTING

A buly shares personal and private information, pictures or video about someone publicly.



FLAMING

Sentar to harassment, it refers to an online fight exchanged via emails, instant messaging or chatrooms.



EXCLUSION

Intentionally singling out and leaving a person out of an online group such as chars and sites. The group then subsequently leaves malcious comments and harasses the person singled out.



MASQUERADING

Albully creates a fake identity to hurasis someone anonymously. In addition to creating a fake identity, the bully impersonates someone sise and sends malloque messages to the victim.

Stick with your bestie- always have a friend you can trust when going places.


Avoid, avoid, avoid -walk away when others start using a drug. Remove yourself from the area completely.






