




Center For Youth

The Center for Youth delivers the Alternatives to Suspension (ATS) program at School #17 as well as other conflict mediation services. ATS is designed to:

- reduce short-term, out-of-school suspensions;
- minimize disruptive behavior;
- avoid future suspensions;
- and keep youth on track with their academics.

Instead of sending students home, the school keeps students in a classroom with a Social Learning Specialist from The Center for Youth and a teacher or teacher's aide. The Center for Youth provides socio-emotional support and teaches life-skills and positive coping mechanisms, while the teacher ensures the students complete their regular classroom assignments.



In its 9th year at School #17, the **Help Me Read** program matches elementary level students with an adult reading mentor from the community. Mentors/tutors travel to the school on a weekly basis to meet one-on-one with their assigned student, where they read books and engage in other educational and personal enrichment activities. Tutors act as a collaborative partner with parents and teachers, working hand-in-hand to improve students' academic and social/emotional skills. The program, through which 65 tutors worked with 202 students last school year, is administered by the Celebration of Life Community.

Healthi Kids works with parents, students, teachers and community members to advocate for physical activity and unstructured play through daily school recess, more inviting play spaces in neighborhoods and safer walking routes to schools. Responding to the campaign's advocacy efforts, the Rochester City School District adopted a mandatory daily recess policy and banned the withholding of recess as punishment. In addition to active play, Healthi Kids works to improve meals and snack offerings in schools, increase participation in the Summer Food Ser-



vice program and expand the availability of fresh fruits and vegetables in corner stores. The initiative also encourages breastfeeding, which research has shown lowers children's risk of becoming obese later in life.

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
