RISE Partnerships



The Center delivers an array of school-based services to thousands of young people each year, including the Alternative-to-Suspension program, and Prevention Education Services intervention/ prevention/ help zone. Here at RISE Community School we have a Best Self Zone which provides a safe place for students to share thoughts or vent frustration, and resolve conflicts. The CFY staff utilizes Restorative Practice every day.



Foodlink is a great partner that stocks our community food pantry, which feeds our students, parents, and community members. Food Link has partnered with RISE in introducing cooking classes and healthy food options for students and families.
