Dear Rochester City School District Families,

I write to you today with a heavy heart because of the current circumstances we are experiencing around our country and here at home. I openly wept as I watched the riots, marches, protests, and unrest unfold across the country. I have to say that I am struggling. I am angry. I am hurting.

The world has been watching since the tragic death of George Floyd last week in Minneapolis. While many people have expressed their right to protest, some have turned to violence, which we saw unfold yesterday in Rochester.

First and foremost, I want to make sure that everyone remains safe. I am asking that our students and their families adhere to the curfew set in place by Mayor Warren and the City of Rochester. That curfew is in effect from 9:00 p.m. tonight until 7:00 a.m. tomorrow morning.

These violent acts are traumatizing for many of us – students, families, educators, and the community – and I share in your grief and distress. I think about how you are coping with all of this, especially when compounded with the stress of the COVID-19 pandemic. While I am always humbled and inspired by our students' strength and resilience, I also understand that now more than ever, we must provide them the social-emotional supports they need.

Beginning tomorrow, there will be several supports in place for students and families. Finally, I want to thank those of you who participated in the clean-up efforts across the city this morning. It shows that we are RCSD together, and we will support one another in times of difficulty. Please know that we are in this together.
