




Use it to test objects to see if they float or sink.</p>	<p>Bring a ruler or measuring tape outdoors and measure objects in your yard.</p>	<p>Write your sight words using a stick in the dirt or with sidewalk chalk.</p>	<p>Take an egg carton collection walk and fill each egg cup with a cool natural treasure.</p>	<p>"Paint" things with water and a paintbrush. Which objects absorb the water better?</p>
<p>Move like an animal in each location:            North: jump            South: crawl            East: slither            West: fly</p>	<p>Choose a letter of the alphabet. Find 5 things outdoors that begin with that letter.</p>	<p>Find some rocks and try to stack them. How many can you stack before they fall?</p>	<p>Count the number of windows on your house. Is it an odd even number?</p>	<p>Create an obstacle course using balls, hoops, benches, logs, pool noodles, boards, etc.</p>
<p>Collect sticks and use them to create an outdoor maze.</p>	<p>Collect 10 objects from your backyard. Sort them by color, shape, and size.</p>	<p>Create your name using things you find in your backyard such as sticks and leaves.</p>	<p>Look for shadows on your driveway and trace them with sidewalk chalk.</p>	<p>Hunt for sticks and arrange them in order from shortest to longest.</p>
<p>Read a story outdoors.</p>	<p>Find objects outdoors that are smaller, larger and the same size as your hand.</p>	<p>Bring playdough outdoors and use it to make imprints of bark, leaves, and rocks.</p>	<p>Hunt for shapes in nature. Can you find a circle, square, triangle, and rectangle?</p>	<p>Play a game of I Spy.</p>



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


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
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
