SOAR in the Hallway at School #33

School-wide Expectations

What does it look like to be <u>Safe</u>, <u>On task</u>, <u>Always caring and <u>Ready</u> for success in the hallway?</u>

Purpose of the lesson: to maintain safety and establish an efficient way to move through the hallways

Teaching Examples:

- 1. You are ready for lunch and very hungry. Another class is coming down the hall. You remember you can only walk on the right so you wait quietly for them to pass.
- 2. You are walking down the hall and see a great display on the wall. You want to touch it but remember to keep your hands at your sides.
- 3. You have your head turned while you are walking and walk into a friend. You remember to look forward.
- 4. You are skipping or hopping down the hall. You remember to walk.
- 5. You are walking down the hall and you see a friend. You smile and wave but remember not to use your voice.

Student Activities:

- 1. Role play waiting for another class to pass.
- 2. Role play walking on the right in groups of 5.
- 3. Role play walking past a hallway display and keeping hands at your sides.
- 4. Role play seeing a friend in the hallway.

Follow-up activities:

- 1. Compliment your class for walking the correct way in the hall.
- 2. Give a SOAR ticket to a student meeting the expectations.
- 3. Make posters for SOARing in the hallway.
