Social Studies/Science: We are learning about the different types of communities; rural, suburban and urban, and about living and non living things.

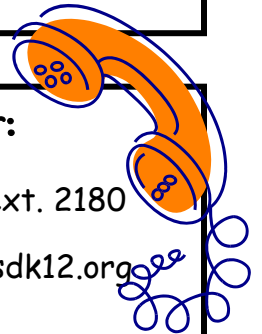
