Mayor Warren Announces Cool Sweep Locations to Help Residents Beat the Summer Heat

(Monday, July 3, 2017)- Mayor Lovely A. Warren today announced the 2017 Cool Sweep program, presented by RG&E and the Avangrid Foundation, to provide opportunities for residents to get relief from the summer heat at City swimming sites, spray parks and fire hydrants.

"As summer heats up, we want to make sure everyone has access to relief from the hot weather," said Mayor Warren. "The City offers many convenient ways beat the heat while having fun. Cool Sweep helps keep our residents safe and healthy which is central to our efforts to create safer and more vibrant neighborhoods, more jobs and better educational opportunities for our children."

The 2017 Cool Sweep season is officially underway and concludes on Saturday, August 26. Cool Sweeps do not take place on Sundays or on July 4. A Cool Sweep operation is triggered when the forecast calls for temperatures to reach or exceed 85 degrees. During Cool Sweep, residents can get relief with cooling sprays at fire hydrants and take advantage of extended hours at City pools and spray parks. Please note that Durand Eastman Beach is closed until further notice due to high water levels.
