
Upper School Summer School

Lower School NYS Testing

NYS is holding testing for Math (grades 6-8) and Science (grade 8). These tests are for HYBRID students only. On Thursday, May 6th, all HYBRID scholars who report to school will take the Math exam from 11 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. This day is an ASYNCHRONOUS day for 100% remote learners; teachers will post assignments for 100% remote scholars to complete. The 8th grade science exam will be on Thursday, June 10th for HYBRID scholars. More details will be shared.

Dear Parents and Guardians of Advanced Placement Scholars,

If your scholar takes Advanced Placement courses at East High School, the schedule of exams is below. All exams will take place at school on the designated date and time listed below. For scholars that are 100% remote, please communicate with your teachers whether or not you plan on coming in to take the exam and potentially earning college credit. The district will provide transportation for those who need it. Additionally, the district will provide breakfast and lunch for scholars who are testing in the building. Your child will need to bring their fully charged Chromebook to school with them for testing.

Remember, *typically*, scholars who earn AP Exam grades of a 3 or above are generally considered to be qualified to receive college credit. The benefit of students taking APs in high school is to allow scholars to take extra electives in college, complete college earlier or take a lighter load one semester. Please reach out to your scholar's counselor to explore AP credit policies for the universities and colleges of your choice.


