

### What is a gist?

- A gist is a tiny summary of main points of a section of text.
- A gist should be a "note" of no more than 4-6 words (less than a sentence)
- Gists should be made in the margin of text you are reading.
- Gisting should happen for a paragraph or two of text.

# Why is it important to gist parts of what you are reading?

### Gisting helps readers...

- ...make sense of parts of text.
- ...make sense of the text as a whole.
- ...become efficient (fast and well) readers.
- ...find topics within text quicker.
- ...understand central ideas of whole texts.
- ...understand how texts are set-up in parts.

### **Quick Review – Things Close Readers Do ...**



Read with a PURPOSE!



Get the gist – figure out what sections of the text is mostly about

Re-read

**Annotaate!** 

Cite evidence

Use details from the text to make inferences

Use context clues to figure out word meanings

Notice details

Answer questions based on the text
