




#### A **Folktale** is:


- a tale or legend

- originating from the common people of a certain culture
- often include supernatural elements

- Get the gist figure out what the text is mostly about
- Cite evidence -
  - -author's use of imagery & sensory language
- Use details from the text to make inferences
- Use context clues to figure out word meanings
- Continuously think about how all this comes together for you as the reader
- Talk with others about the text







A theme in A Long Walk to Water was: Individuals can survive challenging environments in a variety of ways.


