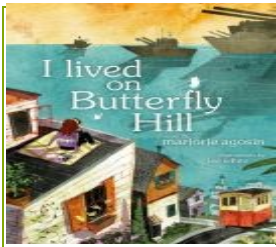


RocRead for Grade 6

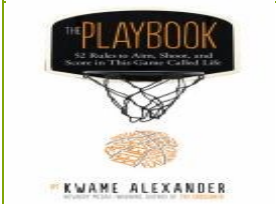
1. Visit your local library branch for books, videos, computers, and Wi-Fi!

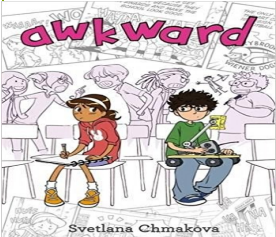
Agosin, Marjorie: I Lived on Butterfly Hill

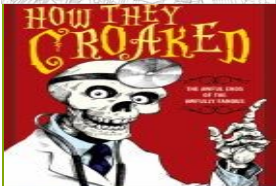
Alexander, Kwame: The Playbook: 52 Rules to Aim, Shoot, and Score in this Game Called Life

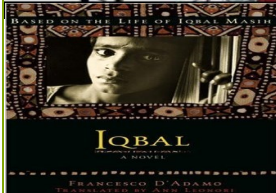
Chmakova, Svetlana: Awkward

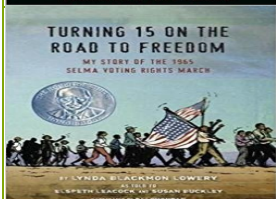
Bragg, Georgia: How They Croaked: The Awful Ends of the Awfully Famous

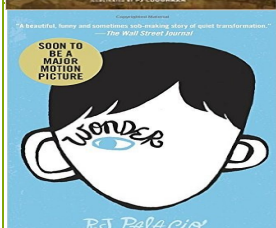
D'Adamo, Francesco: Iqbal: A Novel

A fictionalized account of the Pakistani child who escaped from bondage in a carpet factory and went on to help liberate other children like him before being gunned down at the age of thirteen.



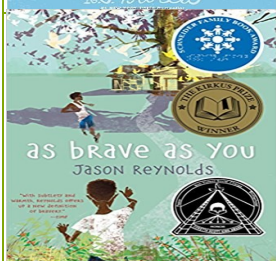
Lowery, Lynda Blackmon: Turning 15 on the Road to Freedom: My Story of the 1965 Selma Voting Rights March

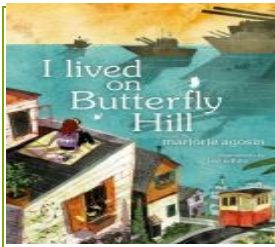

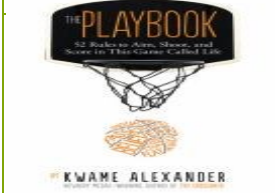

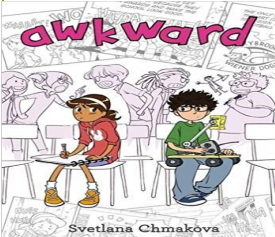
Agosin, Marjorie: I Lived on Butterfly Hill

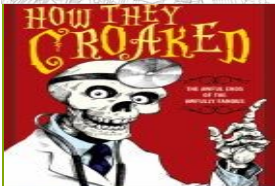
Alexander, Kwame: The Playbook: 52 Rules to Aim, Shoot, and Score in this Game Called Life

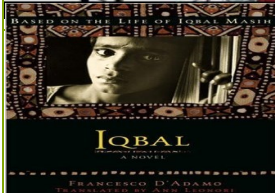
Chmakova, Svetlana: Awkward

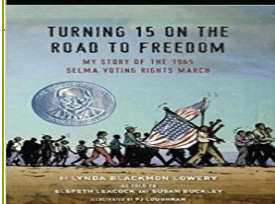
Bragg, Georgia: How They Croaked: The Awful Ends of the Awfully Famous

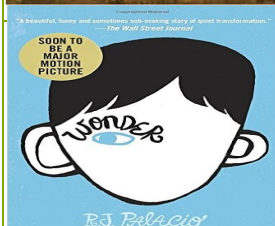
D'Adamo, Francesco: Iqbal: A Novel

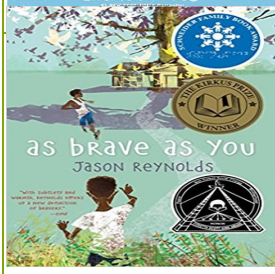
Lowery, Lynda Blackmon: Turning 15 on the Road to Freedom: My Story of the 1965 Selma Voting Rights March
