I wonder if it's that simple?

I am twenty-two, colored, born in Winston-Salem. I went to school there, then Durham, then here to this college on the hill above Harlem, through a park, then I cross St. Nicholas, Eighth Avenue, Seventh, and I come to the Y, the Harlem Branch Y, where I take the elevator up to my room, sit down, and write this page:

It's not easy to know what is true for you or me at twenty-two, my age. But I guess I'm what

I feel and see and hear. Harlem, I hear you: hear you, hear me -- we two -- you, me, talk on this page. (I hear New York, too) Me -- who?

Well, I like to eat, sleep, drink, and be in love. I like to work, read, learn, and understand life. I like a pipe for a Christmas present, or records -- Bessie, bop, or Bach.

I guess being colored doesn't make me not like the same things other folks like who are other races. So will my page be colored that I write? Being me, it will not be white. But it will be a part of you, instructor. You are white -- yet a part of me, as I am a part of you. That's American.

Sometimes perhaps you don't want to be a part of me. Nor do I often want to be a part of you. But we are, that's true! As I learn from you, I guess you learn from me -- although you're older -- and white -- and somewhat more free.

THEME FOR ENGLISH B

Project

- Write your own **personal** theme defining who you are.
- EMPHASIZE YOUR INNER SELF (What do you think and feel about different things, people...?)
- The first 5 lines are to be exactly the same as the original poem.
- The last line is to be the same as the original poem.
- You need a **minimum of 26 original lines**. (The required 6 lines do not count towards this.)
- Final copy must be **typed**. (See teacher immediately if this presents a problem.)
- Final presentation should be creative, colorful, and personalized. (pictures, art work, clip art, stickers...) These should be on the same side as the theme.
- Your poem should fit on one side of a piece of 8 ½ X 11 sheet of paper.
- You may use a maximum size backing paper of <u>10 X 12</u>.
- Do not simply use the format of the original poem.
- You will present your theme orally to the class.
- * Some inner thoughts must be included.

Before you begin writing, think about how the following answers can serve as inspiration.

- 1. Who are you?
- 2. How do you fit into the environment of your family, your school, your community, your country, and even our world?
- 3. How does your ethnicity, social class, or gender help define your personality and deepest, truest self?

Grade based on the following:

- Writing creativity & structure
- Presentation (projection/voice/tone/eye contact)
- Design neatness & creativity
