  - 1155 kids graduated 81.5% in June; 86% in August
  - Application may have been down but no one was able to be moved off of the waiting list and the self-contained rooms are full and the district placed students in the school in the incoming 7th grade students with special needs in the school. Net result is that 12 students who did not audition were placed. Central office originally slated 23 additional special needs students to be here and Nicastro was able to prove that there was no room for 23. Belculfine will work with the parents of other students to try to audition at the end of 7th and end of 8th. The goal is to keep the students at SOTA, but if any do not successfully audition after 8th grade they will be transferred out. For some, SOTA was not at all a first choice. There are 27 total self contained (12:1:1 and 15:1) classrooom spots at SOTA. 15 were filled through audition spots and then 12 were sent here by the district. Next year admin will be more actively recruit special needs students and be sure they get a chance to audition
  - A parent asked about suspension rate seems to have been high last year, will restorative practices be used. Miss Feorella will attend restorative

- justice training to work with the students and the middle school counselor will give strategies on coping during advisement;
- Mr. jones (CASE) is no longer at school. There is a district wide CASE administratorr who comes 3x per month. Building designee will be at CSE hearings; CASE will only do any more restrictive or new plan;
- A parent asked about Advisement classes 12<sup>th</sup> graders have multiple advisements at high school level kids picked their classes if child did not choose some classes then there may have been more advisement new electives being offered statistics; online classes; computer science; virtual psychology; virtual classes
- Students can also seek early dismissal if they want to work in the afternoon must be approved by parents
