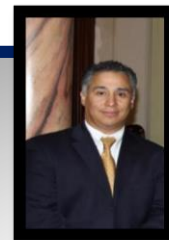


Scholar Jaimee Prass by Mrs. Mrs. Scheirer

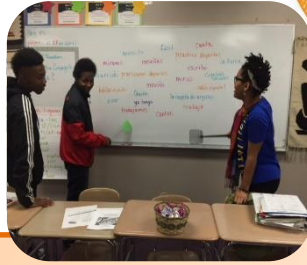

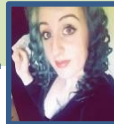
