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Required Communications

Generally accepted auditing standards require the auditor to promote effective two-way communication between the auditor and those charged with governance. Consistent with this requirement, the following summarizes our responsibilities regarding the financial statement audit as well as observations arising from our audit that are significant and relevant to your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process.

Our Responsibilities with regard to the Financial Statement Audit	Our responsibilities under auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and <i>Government Auditing Standards</i> issued by the Comptroller General of the United States have been described to you in our arrangement letter dated May 28, 2015. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve management or those charged with governance of their responsibilities which are also described in that letter.
Overview of the Planned Scope and Timing of the Financial Statement Audit	We have issued a separate communication regarding the planned scope and timing of our audit and have discussed with you our identification of and planned audit response to significant risks of material misstatement.
Accounting Policies and Practices	Preferability of Accounting Policies and Practices Under generally accepted principles, in certain circumstances, management may select among alternative accounting practices. In our view, in such circumstances, management has selected the preferable accounting practice. Adoption of, or Change in, Accounting Policies Management has the ultimate responsibility for the appropriateness of the accounting policies used by the RJSCB. The RJSCB adopted GASB Interpretation No. 6 – Recognition and Measurement of Certain Liabilities and Expenditures in Governmental Fund Financial Statements.
	Significant or Unusual Transactions We did not identify any significant or unusual transactions or significant accounting policies in controversial or emerging areas for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

Area	Comments
	<p>Management's Judgments and Accounting Estimates</p> <p>Accounting estimates are an integral part of the preparation of financial statements and are based upon management's current judgment. The process used by management encompasses their knowledge and experiences about past and current events and certain assumptions about future events. Management has informed us they used all the relevant facts available to them at the time to make the best judgments about accounting estimates and we considered this information in the scope of our audit. Management has determined that there are no significant estimates and judgments at this time.</p>
Basis of Accounting	The financial statements were prepared on assumption that the entity will continue as a going concern.
Audit Adjustments	There were no audit adjustments noted during our audit.
Uncorrected Misstatements	There were no uncorrected misstatements noted during our audit.
Disagreements with Management	We encountered no disagreements with management over the application of significant accounting principles, the basis for management's judgments on any significant matters, the scope of the audit, or significant disclosures to be included in the financial statements.
Consultations with Other Accountants	We are not aware of any consultations management had with other accountants about accounting or auditing matters.
Significant Issues Discussed with Management	No significant issues arising from the audit were discussed with or the subject of correspondence with management.
Significant Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit	We did not encounter any significant difficulties in dealing with management during the audit.
Certain Written Communications Between Management and Our Firm	A copy of certain written communications between our firm and the management of the RJSCB are attached as Exhibit A.

Recently Issued Accounting Standards

The GASB has issued several statements not yet implemented by RJSCB. The RJSCB's management has not yet determined the effect these Statements will have on the RJSCB's financial statements. However, the RJSCB plans to implement all standards by the required dates. The Statements which might impact the RJSCB are as follows:

Summary of GASB Statement No. 72 *Fair Value Measurement and Application*

This Statement issued in February 2015 will be effective for the District beginning with its year ending June 30, 2016. The objective of this Statement is to define fair value, how fair value is measured, what assets and liabilities should be measured at fair value, and what information about fair value should be reported in the notes to the financial statements. The definition of fair value in GASB Statement No. 72 is consistent with the definition of fair value in FASB *Accounting Standards Codification* (FASB ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*. Additionally, GASB Statement No. 72 utilizes the same three-level hierarchy for measuring fair value that is used in FASB ASC 820. Although GASB Statement No. 72 is similar to the FASB's guidance on fair value, GASB Statement No. 72 differs in some ways with the FASB literature. The requirements of GASB Statement No. 72 are effective for financial statements for periods beginning after June 15, 2015. Earlier application is encouraged.

This representation letter is provided in connection with your audit of the basic financial statements of the Rochester Joint Schools Construction Board (the "RJSCB") as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015 for the purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the financial statements are presented fairly, in all material respects in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP).

We confirm, to the best of our knowledge and belief, as of the date of the auditor's report:

Financial Statements

1. We have fulfilled our responsibilities, as set out in the terms of the audit arrangement letter dated May 28, 2015, for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements referred to above in accordance with U.S. GAAP.
2. We acknowledge our responsibility for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.
3. We acknowledge our responsibility for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control to prevent and detect fraud.
4. Significant assumptions used by us in making accounting estimates, including those measured at fair value, are reasonable and reflect our judgment based on our knowledge and experience about past and current events and our assumptions about conditions we expect to exist and courses of action we expect to take.
5. Related party transactions including interfund accounts receivable, accounts payable and interfund transfers have been recorded in accordance with the economic substance of the transaction and appropriately accounted for and disclosed in accordance with the requirements of U.S. GAAP.
6. All events subsequent to the date of the financial statements and for which U.S. GAAP requires adjustment or disclosure have been adjusted or disclosed.
7. The effects of all known actual or possible litigation and claims have been accounted for and disclosed in accordance with U.S. GAAP.
8. The following have been properly recorded and/or disclosed in the financial statements:
 - a. Net position.
 - b. Arrangements with financial institutions involving compensating balances or other arrangements involving restrictions on cash balances.

- c. All significant estimates and material concentrations known to management which are required to be disclosed.
 - d. The effect on the financial statements of GASB Pronouncements that have been issued, but which we have not yet adopted.
 - e. Deposits and investment securities category of risk.
9. We have complied with all aspects of contractual agreements that would have a material effect on the financial statements in the event of noncompliance.
 10. We have no direct or indirect, legal or moral obligation for any debt of any organization, public or private, that is not disclosed in the financial statements.
 11. We have no knowledge of any uncorrected misstatements to the financial statements.

Information Provided

12. We have provided you with:
 - a. Access to all information of which we are aware that is relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements such as records, documentation, and other matters;
 - b. Additional information that you have requested from us for the purpose of the audit.
 - c. Unrestricted access to persons within the RJSCB from whom you determined it necessary to obtain audit evidence.
 - d. Minutes of the meetings of the governing board and committees of board members, or summaries of actions of recent meetings for which minutes have not yet been prepared.
13. All transactions have been recorded in the accounting records and are reflected in the financial statements.
14. We have disclosed to you the results of our assessment of risk that the financial statements may be materially misstated as a result of fraud.
15. We have no knowledge of allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the RJSCB's financial statements involving:
 - a. Management.
 - b. Employees who have significant roles in the internal control.
 - c. Others where the fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements.
16. We have no knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the financial statements received in communications from employees, former employees, analysts, regulators, short sellers, or others.
17. We have no knowledge of noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations whose effects should be considered when preparing financial statements.
18. We are not aware of any pending or threatened litigation and claims whose effects should be considered when preparing the financial statements.
19. We have disclosed to you the identity of the related parties and all the related-party relationships and transactions of which we are aware.
20. We are aware of no significant deficiencies, including material weaknesses, in the design or operation of internal controls that could adversely affect the RJSCB's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data.


21. We are aware of no communications from regulatory agencies concerning noncompliance with, or deficiencies in, financial reporting practices.


Compliance Considerations


In connection with your audit, conducted in accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we confirm that management:
