




Success of the programs evaluated on an on-going basis

Full-time Parent Liaison and Social Worker on site, with Speech/OT/PT support




Students learn through play and hands-on activities with a focus on language development, self-esteem, and independence



Parents able to earn high school equivalency diploma attending classes at RECEC








Addressing Long-Term Enrollment Challenge

If students start with the RCSD, they stay in the RCSD






Adding Pre-K Capacity Within the District









Open two additional RCSD Early Childhood Centers

One each to be located in the South and Northwest zones






This will result in Pre-K school in each of the 3 zones (Rochester Early Childhood Education Center is located in the Northeast zone)








School Reconfiguration Recommendations Early Childhood School of Rochester No. 57 (Pre-K – 2)


