# Classwork, Homework, Projects & Grading ...a few tests and quizzes too!

All students can be successful in art class if they always do their very best, strive to improve their art skills and knowledge and complete all the work on time.

Student will have ample time to complete classwork but if they miss an assignment or fall behind, they should see me to see how they can make the work up, options usually are: homework, see me during lunch or afterschool.

Homework is minimal and

usually consists of "look and wonder" assignments which asks students to become aware of the art around them and studying art theory, vocabulary and art history.

All major projects will include a rubric, a timeline with graded "in progress checkpoints" and clear requirements. As the year progresses students will also do "self-grading" so they can begin to take responsibility and accountability for the work they produce.

Tests and quizzes will be given to assess students knowledge on Art Theory, vocabulary, art history and art skills.

I keep my gradebook online and I encourage you to frequently check you students gradebook and contact me if you have any questions or

## Course Outline: Studio in Art

I follow the NYSED Art Standards and course requirements for ART7/8 and the RCSD Art Curriculum pacing. I start the year reviewing the key components of the elementary curriculum to ensure students are prepared for the middle school curriculum.

**Art theory: Elements and Principles of Art** The basic theory of all art, for most students, the Elements and Principles of art is a review. Vocabulary is emphasized to encourage students to use correct terminology when discussing art.

<u>Drawing</u> The foundation of art, drawing skills and techniques are taught, sketching in all forms is encouraged as a means of building drawing skills. Various drawing media (beyond) pencil is explored.

<u>Painting</u> Techniques for both watercolor and tempera paints are explored. Color theory is expanded.

<u>3D art</u> Students will explore and create sculpture and 3 dimensional art, and public art and it's role in society will be emphasized.

**Printmaking** Students will learn about the importance of printmaking and it's historical and current impact on society. Students will explore various printmaking processes.

<u>Crafts</u> Students will learn about crafts as art. The American craft movement in an historical context and utilitarian objects as art.

<u>Media Arts/Graphic Design</u> Students will explore graphic arts as a communication device and the influence on society.

<u>Art Criticism</u> Students will use art theory (Elements and Principles of art) to convey their opinions of their own artwork and historical artwork.

<u>Art History</u> Students will explore art in a historical and cultural context.

<u>Art Careers</u> Students will explore the many careers and paths available to arts.
