The family of Gian Ortiz is donating more than 60 books to third-grade students at Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. School No. 9. Gian sadly passed away six years ago at the tender age of two after a five-month stay in a neonatal intensive care unit. To honor his memory, Gian's family has partnered with the Rochester Education Foundation (REF) to donate books each year to students in the grade Gian would have been attending. Orlando Ortiz, Gian's father, is a former student at School No. 9. Students will be receiving books such as Ada Twist and the Perilous Pants, Iggy Peck and the Mysterious Mansion, and Mia Mayhem Steals the Show. Books being donated include authors of color and feature characters of color.
