The Department of Instructional Technology has deployed 7000 Google
Chromebooks throughout the district. The Chromebook environment
requires ongoing teacher training to maximize the potential impacts on
student learning. RCSD eLearning (Online PD) has become the
preferred delivery method for technology training. The 2014-15 school

year was a pilot year for incorporating 1-to-1 hardware platforms in multiple schools: Schools 58, Nathaniel Rochester STEM School, School 34 (a Priority School), Early College High School, and Integrated Arts and Technology High School, Rochester International Academy and School Without Walls-Commencement. Additionally, Chromebooks have been deployed to 37 elementary buildings. The 1-to-1 initiative provides students wireless access to a blended digital curriculum and access to an online, collaborative environment. Optimum student and teacher use requires ongoing training in: the purposeful integration of the devices with classroom instruction and laptop support, and maintenance techniques. These pilots have set the foundation for the District to prepare for the effective, scaled rollout of future one-to-one programs; thus ensuring RCSD students and RCSD 1-to-1 programs employ competitive, technological, and educational best practices of the 21st Century.
