Whereas, the Rochester City School District, by authority of the Board of Education has previously appeared in that case as *amicus curiae* and argued that providing a sound basic education to the high concentrations of poor, minority, limited English proficiency and special

needs students in urban areas required dedication of resources which exceeded both the amounts available under current state formulae and the capacity or will of local governments; and that the financial problems of school districts statewide were complicated by extensive regulation by, and mandates of, the State without full and adequate funding for such regulations and mandates; and

Whereas, the Board of Education of the Rochester City School District supports the concept expressed in the February 2003 preliminary "New York Adequacy Study" of the American Institutes for Research, noting that school districts with high and average "needs to resource capacity" need supplemental State support to fulfill the State's constitutional mandate to provide a sound basic education; and

Whereas, the court mandated that the state determine the actual cost of a meaningful high school education in New York City, and that such "costing-out" and other mandates of the decision be fulfilled by July 30, 2004; and

Whereas, both the majority and concurring opinions at the Court of Appeals noted that its mandate could be met by formulating an approach that was statewide in scope; and

Whereas, statewide school funding reform would be the only fair and just response to the CFE decision, given that: (1) many other school districts in the state have similar problems of inadequate resources that led the Court of Appeals to find a constitutional violation in regard to New York City and given that (2) it would be impractical to design a statutory remedy that only applies to New York City; and

Whereas, it would be unconscionable for the state to wait another year before addressing the issues highlighted in the CFE decision and to fail to direct resources where the most urgent needs exist;

Therefore be it resolved that, the Board of Education of the Rochester City School District strongly supports the enactment of legislation before July 30, 2004 consistent with the "Criteria for a New Funding System" drafted by the Alliance for Quality Education and the Campaign for Fiscal Equity, which advocates that the new school funding system meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Adequate funding for every school in the state;
- ✓ Accountability;
- ✓ Sustained, stable, and predictable funding;
- ✓ A simple and transparent system; and
- ✓ An increased state share of education spending.

Be it further resolved that, the Board of Education of the Rochester City School District supports, as a part of an overall solution to meeting the needs of poor, minority, limited English proficiency and special needs students in urban areas, State legislation that would require that STAR payments be made directly to fiscally dependent school districts; requiring that a maintenance of effort formula be adopted in localities with financially dependent school districts, so that changes in the consumer price index of such localities will be reflected in local funding; and providing for the State to assume direct funding and direct support services for charter schools, thus relieving local school districts from mandatory provision of such services, and from diversion of State and federal funds to such charter schools; and

Be it further resolved that, while fully cognizant that no consensus yet exists as to the full cost of meeting the Court of Appeals' directive, on a statewide basis, to meet the State's constitutional burden, the Board of Education of the Rochester City School District, supports the inclusion of no less than \$2 billion in new and additional funding for schools in the 2004-05 state fiscal year, as a "down payment" on implementation of the CFE decision to address the most urgent priorities of schools and in order to begin a multi-year process of fulfilling the mandates of the Court of Appeals decision in Campaign for Fiscal Equity vs. State.

Resolved, that the supervision and evaluation of Board of Education staff shall be assigned to the Board Governance Committee from this date through to December 31, 2004, and that evaluation data collected for the evaluation of staff for the period January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2004 shall be turned over to the Board Governance Committee no later than March 15, 2004, that being the next scheduled Board Governance Committee meeting, for purposes of concluding the evaluation process for that period.

Be it further resolved, that the Board of Education budget proposed by Board staff be entered into the 2004-05 budget planning cycle, and that any additions or amendments be referred to the Board Governance Committee for review and recommendation back to the full Board of Education.
