Ratifying Collective Bargaining Agreement with Association of Administrators and Supervisors of Rochester

Whereas, the negotiators representing the Superintendent of Schools and the Association of Administrators and Supervisors of Rochester (ASAR) have met and reached a tentative collective bargaining agreement for the period July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2006, and

Whereas the membership of ASAR have ratified the agreement, therefore, be it

Resolved, that pursuant to the provisions of Civil Service Law sections 201 and 204-a, the Board of Education approves the following new or modified from the previous agreement economic provisions:

- 1. Increase in annual salaries of 3.9%, 3.95% and 3.975% for each of 3 years in the agreement.
- 2. Increase of \$1500 added to base salaries on July 1, 2004, prior to application of the general salary increase, for all Bracket IV members in return for an increase in the work year from 10 months-10 days to 10 months-20 days.
- 3. In addition to the increase set forth in paragraph 2 above, an increase, effective July 1, 2004, of \$2000 added to base salaries, prior to application of the general salary increase, for all members assigned to Central Office, either full-time or part-time, in return for an increase in the work year to 12 months.
- 4. Definition of the normal workday as extending 90 minutes beyond the daily dismissal of students for members assigned full-time to schools, and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., including lunch, for members assigned full or part-time to Central Office, with no additional compensation during the normal workday.
- 5. Payment at the hourly rate of \$40 for required professional development beyond the normal workday and payment at the hourly rate of \$29 for all other work of a professional nature.
- 6. For members working 12 months, 25 vacation days per school year and a cash-in of accumulated unused vacation days upon separation at the rate of 1/240 of base salary. Members are allowed to cash in a maximum of 5 vacation days annually.
- 7. An increase of \$2000 added to the 2003-2004 base salary effective July 1, 2004 prior to the application of the general salary increase, in return for an increase from 35 hours to 40 hours for non-hourly former MLMSA members.
- 8. Modifications of MLMSA salary ranges, not to exceed \$25,000 in aggregate costs to the District, effective July 1, 2004.

Ratifying Collective Bargaining Agreement with Rochester Teachers' Association

Whereas, the negotiators representing the Superintendent of Schools and the Rochester Teachers' Association (RTA) have met and concluded a tentative collective bargaining agreement for the period July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2006, and thereafter, and

Whereas the membership of the RTA have ratified the agreement, therefore, be it

Resolved, that pursuant to the provisions of Civil Service Law sections 201 and 204-a, the Board of Education approves the tentative agreement including the following economic provisions:

- 1. Salary increases of 4.45% each year in accordance with the provisions of the salary benchmarking concept, and inclusive of step increases.
- 2. The Board's provision of adequate facilities, equipment, supplies and teaching materials for all teachers to carry out the instructional program in each school.
- 3. The limitation of class size not to exceed the following in any class: 28 in grades 3-6; 27 in grades K-2; 28 in grades 7,8 and 9 in Middle School Clusters, unless a school's SBPT approves unique configurations.
- 4. Extending through June 30, 2006 the use of Blue Choice Value and Preferred Care Opportunity plans, coupled with the funding of a medical reimbursement account (105 Plan), in lieu of the Blue Choice Select and Preferred Care Community 201-1 plans.
- 5. Providing monetary incentives to teachers who document engagement in professional development activities beyond what is provided through other sections of the collective bargaining agreement after the first year of employment as follows: an additional \$700 stipend to Resident level teachers for completion of an additional 24 hours of professional development activities and an additional \$1050 stipend to Professional level and Lead teachers for completion of an additional 36 hours of professional development activities.
- 6. Creating an absentee reduction plan to encourage teacher attendance and reduce the cost and disruption that occurs to the instructional programs when the regular classroom teacher is absent, providing credits earned and cash payments, based on a year-end review of attendance, as follows: no illness days used \$115 per day; one illness day used \$95 per day; two illness days used \$80 per day; three illness days used \$70 per day, up to a maximum amount to be paid to a teacher upon resignation or retirement (after 10 years of service) of \$25,000.
- 7. Eliminating compensation for teachers who attend evening parent-teacher conferences.
- 8. Shortening the instructional day on each Wednesday by twenty minutes and requiring teachers to be available for one hour after the dismissal of students for professional development or additional instructional services for students who need such help; up to 50% of the professional development time will be directed by the district and the remaining time directed by the SBPT. This time is without additional compensation.

9. Part-time employees with regular contract substitute status working less than .5 FTE shall receive health insurance benefits on a pro-rated basis.

Whereas, the Board of Education is committed to find methods of both enhancing the modes of delivery and the scope of health services to Rochester City School District children; and at the same time enhancing cost efficiencies and obtaining additional resources for and their critical health needs; and

Whereas, the fiscal challenges inherent in meeting the specific needs of our children, in an environment of uncertain revenue streams, the District's fiscal dependence, and of pervasive unfunded or underfunded mandates have been exacerbated by the unilateral decision of Monroe County to abdicate the school health service that it has provided to children in city schools since 1958, leaving practical, legal and financial gaps which must be bridged for the coming fiscal year; and

Whereas, one promising approach to addressing the need for integrating school health services and a proactive and cost effective manner to support the overall educational program and to enhance student attendance, is a collaborative Tele Medicine pilot project, which would begin with five elementary schools in the Northeast Quadrant of the city (Schools 8, 22, 22 Annex, 45 and 50), intended to explore strategies to integrate the resources of traditional school nursing and of the health insurance community with available medical technology and telecommunications, the telemedicine staff of the University of Rochester Medical Center and pediatric groups serving many of the children and families residing in the service areas of the pilot group schools, or any expansion thereof; it is

Resolved, that the Board of Education hereby supports the efforts of Dr. Kenneth McConnochie, MD, MPH in pursuing grant funding for the Telehealth Demonstration Project in Rochester City Schools.
