Ratifying Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Rochester Teachers Association-Rochester Preschool Parent Program

Whereas, the Rochester City School District ("District") has recognized the Rochester Teachers Association's ("RTA") claim to represent the positions of teacher, parent group leader and peer consultants within the District's Rochester Preschool Parent Program (RPPP) as a new and separate unit under the existing collective bargaining agreement in effect between the District and the RTA; and

Whereas, the negotiators representing the Superintendent of Schools and the Rochester Teachers Association (RTA) have met and concluded a tentative collective bargaining agreement pertaining to the Rochester Preschool Parent Program for the period July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009; and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Schools and the RPPP unit membership of RTA have ratified the tentative agreement; **now therefore**, be it

Resolved, that pursuant to the provisions of Civil Service Law sections 201 and 204-a, the Board of Education approves the tentative agreement including the following economic provisions:

- 1. The hourly rate for 2005-2006 for all unit members shall be \$25.48, retroactive to July 1, 2005.
- 2. The hourly rate for teachers shall be \$26.60 in 2006-2007; the hourly rate for teachers in 2007-2008 shall not be less than \$27.77; and the hourly rate for teachers in 2008-2009 shall not be less than \$28.99.
- 3. All members of the eligible unit who work beyond their normal assignment for comparable work of a professional nature shall be paid at their hourly rate for the actual days or hours assigned and worked beyond their normal work year, including, but not limited to summer inservice, Open House (for teachers and parent group leaders only), Superintendent Conference Days, professional development and staff meetings.
- 4. Teachers will be covered by health insurance, effective July 1, 2006, under the terms of Sections 43 and 44 of the RTA contract.
- 5. The work year shall be 180 instructional days plus twelve paid holidays, for a total of 192 days.
- 6. Compensation for paid holidays shall be based on the standard workday of the unit member.

7. The professional work day for a full-time position shall be seven hours, excluding lunch.
