- 4. Eligible members must notify the Chief Human Resources Officer by June 3, 2005 of their irrevocable intent to retire and retirement dates must be effective on or before August 31, 2005.

This Retirement Incentive Plan will continue into 2005-2006 as follows: ASAR members who meet the eligibility criteria set forth herein and who notify the District on or before April 1, 2006 of their irrevocable intention to retire by June 30, 2006 will receive a \$5000 incentive instead of a \$20,000 incentive, subject to payment in one of the three ways set forth above under paragraph 3.
