- > 40% out of 100% will be graded as a **Formative Assessment**: classwork, homework, etc.

# **Grade Recovery for Tests**

Grade Recovery is an opportunity to improve on a low test or quiz grade. Your first grade must be a 70% or below. You will receive 1/2 point for every point missed.

- In order to do a Grade Recovery you must make an appointment after school within one week of receiving your test/quiz back.
