Student: Onboarding Overview

Onboarding is a one-time, guided experience designed to prepare you to use SchoolLinks. You will complete Onboarding the very first time you log into the platform.

The Onboarding Experience

Onboarding is a 4-part process including:

- Taking the Find Your Path assessment
- Choosing a Career Cluster
- Selecting a Career Goal
- Selecting a Major/Training Goal

**Note: the choices you make in onboarding are not permanent. You will be able to retake the Find Your Path assessment and change goals after completing the onboarding process.*

The first time you log in to SchoolLinks, you will be prompted to complete "Onboarding." Click Let's go to get started.



- Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security**
You'll be responsible for providing for the safety and order of your community by protecting people from crime, fire, and disasters or working in the court system.
- Government & Public Administration**
There are many roles in government that keep our communities running smoothly. You can serve in local, state, or federal government or in organizations that provide for the common good.
- Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources**
This cluster focuses on how to manage, preserve, and distribute natural resources, and can involve working in food or agriculture.
- Architecture & Construction**
You would be responsible for designing, planning, building, and maintaining structures such as building, homes, highways, and bridges.
