4:03	15	Topic: School Improvement Plan NOTES: Katie shared that we used all our data from the NYS test to develop our SIP. Then we used our own data sources to take a deeper look at areas of concern. The following areas will be our focus: ● Reviewed Plan- 3 goals are concrete ● Reading for literature (central idea) showing up more on state test ● Close Reading- compare/contrast both nonfiction/fiction ● Laser focus on RI2, RL2 and W4 ● Math-focus on constructed responses using Try, Discuss, and Connect. We want students to be “talking math.” ● Con’t using student centers for practice ● Using the data from the School Climate Responses- 25-26. Academic Culture Focus: student voice, building positive relationships, getting students more involved using Culturally Responsive Classrooms. We want to focus on building healthy relationships between teachers/staff/students. ● Roc Restorative Champions will run training for peer mediation Katie shared with us the results from the School Climate Responses. We first looked at the question regarding if students feel safe in their school. Then we talked about the question that asked how often does your school affirm your identity. Last we looked at the question regarding their sense of belonging. All of these questions were below 85% so we will make this a goal in the SIP. Then Katie shared data from the staff survey. We will be collecting more information to dig deeper when we meet with staff and students to ask why they responded “rarely” or “sometimes.” Our goal is 70%.
