1. Welcome: Called to order at 4 p.m.

2. **Approval of minutes** from February 28, 2017 meeting: Lisa Tilley made a motion, Karyn Bartnick seconded. All approved as amended.

3. Reports:

# a) SLS Director (Colleen Sadowski):

- 1. TrueNorth Update -- all PD has been entered except for one class which will be entered Friday; reviewed PD's that were submitted and still awaiting approval.
- 2. Annual Report was approved on March 31, 2017 -- financials were perfect.
- 3. Superintendent's Conference Day Update -- survey responses (29) were overall favorable; they will be given to the Deputy Superintendent; make sure you ask for citywides in new survey being sent out; RTA will not back the citywide meetings.
- 4. Library budgets -- a lot of money was not spent so it will be used to purchase ebooks; librarians who do not spend budget money will find that it will be withheld next year.
- 5. Librarians will report back to work on August 28th for the 2017-2018 school year.
- 6. Discussion on year-end procedures -- a complete finalized inventory is expected to be completed each year as part of a librarian's year-end evaluation. Because the inventory is not completed before evaluations are due, the inventory from the previous year will be used in the evaluation. Molly volunteered to help with inventory.
- 7. School #1 is closing -- librarians will be sent a calendar invite by Colleen to take items for their own libraries; this will happen after 2:30 p.m. so students do not see the library being dismantled; boxes will be available; June 23rd will be the last day staff can take materials; librarians will be asked to weed the collection as they go through it; good books will be saved and possibly used for distribution in August.
- School Construction: #15 will go to #1; #16 will stay put for another 1-2 years; #2 & 4 will move into Marshall; #22 will move to #6; Franklin will become the new swing space; RIA will go to Jefferson; Monroe construction is behind schedule and may require another year or two; #19 is being updated without staff/student moving.
- 9. Makerspaces to go: printer is broken and will go back to company for service; new one has been purchased which is a bigger model; we should have at least four in the library system next year.

### b) RRLC (Kathy Miller):

- 1. Winners have been announced for RRLC's Annual "Love Your Library" contest-Fairport Public Library; Our Lady of Mercy for Young Women; St. John Fisher College, Lavery Library and Honorable Mentions; there was a 28% increase in nominations this year; the winners will receive a banner for the library, a cash award, and recognition at the annual dinner at Casa Larga Vineyards, Thursday, June 1, 2017
