WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2009-10: 92, adopted on July 28, 2009, the Board authorized the Superintendent to enter into a New York State Type II Food Services Agreement with ARAMARK Educational Services LLC, to provide management of the school food services operation, for the 2009 – 2010 school year, renewable for up to four additional one-year terms; and

WHEREAS, the District wishes to renew the Agreement with ARAMARK Educational Services LLC; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent, or his designee, be, and hereby is, authorized to renew the New York State Type II Food Services Agreement with **ARAMARK Educational Services LLC**, 1101 Market Street, Philadelphia, PA, to provide management of the school food services operation, for the 2010-2011 school year, such services will be charged to the District at a rate of \$0.8956 per Breakfast served, \$0.8805 per lunch served, and \$0.6112 per snack served, funded by the School Food Services Fund, through the School Food Services Department, contingent upon the form and terms of the Agreement having been approved by Counsel to the District.

Amending Resolution No. 2009-10: 1015 to revise Effective Date of Retirement Incentive Program - Part B

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2009-10: 1015, adopted on June 17, 2010, the Board elected to provide the benefits of Part B of Chapter 105 of the Laws of 2010, commencing on June 18, 2010, for all eligible employees who retire with an effective date of retirement set during the ninety-two (92) day period beginning with and immediately following the commencement date, and who are otherwise eligible as specified by Part B of Chapter 105, Laws of 2010; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2010, the District received notification from the New York State that the effective date must be a ninety (90) day period of June 2 through August 30, 2010, or June 3 through August 31, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to elect the “open period” period of June 2 through August 30, 2010; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent, or his designee, be, and hereby is, authorized to enter into an Agreement with **Hillside Family of Agencies (Hillside Children's Center)**, 1183 Monroe Avenue, Rochester, NY, whereby Hillside Children's Center will offer a program to students in 6:1:1 classrooms who are enrolled in the RCSD/Hillside Day Treatment Program at Clara Barton School No. 2, and offer a secondary program for 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students at the District's North S.T.A.R. Educational Program, utilizing positive behavioral interventions (PBI) and crisis intervention models to teach new skills and maintain close communication between home and school to support and enhance student learning, for the period July 1, 2010, or as soon thereafter as the Agreement is fully executed, through June 30, 2011, for a sum not to exceed Four Hundred Thirty Seven Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Three Dollars (\$437,373.00), funded by the IDEA Support Services Section 611 Grant, through the Department of Specialized Services, and contingent upon the form and terms of the Agreement having been approved by Counsel to the District.
