WHEREAS, the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act requires that states develop and report on measures of student proficiency in English language arts, math, and on a third indicator; and

WHEREAS, in New York State (NYS), the third indicator is science at the elementary and middle school level and graduation rate at the secondary level; and

WHEREAS, performance on standardized tests determines whether students can graduate, and are also used to grade schools and to evaluate teachers and principals; and

WHEREAS, many advocates say that high-stakes testing causes unjustifiable stress for students, parents, teachers, and school administrators; and

WHEREAS, the NYS school system has been spending growing amounts of time, money, and energy on high-stakes standardized testing; and

WHEREAS, the over-reliance on high-stakes standardized testing is undermining educational quality and equity in public schools by hindering educators' efforts to focus on the broad range of learning experiences that promote innovation, creativity, and problem solving; and

WHEREAS, it is widely recognized that standardized testing is an inadequate and often unreliable measure of both student learning and educator effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, the over-emphasis on standardized testing has caused considerable collateral damage in too many schools, including the narrowing of the curriculum, teaching to the test, reducing the love of learning, driving excellent teachers out of the profession, and undermining school climate; and

WHEREAS, a nine-year study by the National Research Council has recently confirmed that the past decade's emphasis on testing has yielded little learning progress; and

WHEREAS, high-stakes standardized testing has negative effects for students from all backgrounds, and especially for low-income students, English language learners, children of color, and those with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, research by NAEP shows that the negative effects of our high-stakes testing environment are perhaps most pronounced for English Language Learners for whom the tests were not designed, who cumulatively and consistently fail to achieve proficiency within the limited school time before they are required to take the exam in English; and

WHEREAS, the future well-being of our society relies on a high-quality public education system that prepares all students for college, careers, lifelong learning, and strengthens social as well as economic wellbeing; and

WHEREAS, developing a system based on multiple forms of assessment which does not require extensive standardized testing, would more accurately reflect the broad range of student learning; and

WHEREAS, the culture and structure of the educational systems in which students learn must change in order to foster an engaging school experience that promotes joy in learning, depth of thought, and breadth of knowledge for students; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Rochester City School District Board of Education calls upon the New York State Education Department, the New York State Legislature, and the Governor to

reexamine public school accountability systems and to develop a system based on multiple forms of assessment which do not require extensive standardized testing; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Rochester City School Board supports the performance-based assessment models used by alternative schools represented by the New York State Performance Standards Consortium which assesses student application of skills and knowledge to the real world; and be it further

Each employee shall be appointed to his or her position and title by the Superintendent in writing as of a specific date; the Superintendent's letter of appointment shall be countersigned indicating acceptance by the employee; provided, however, that, upon approval by the Board of Education, employees who report directly to the Superintendent, in place of or in addition to such letter, may be given an individualized contract of employment for a period not to exceed three (3) years, subject to renewal with the approval of the Board, in which in addition to the benefits provided by this section, the compensation may (but need not) include other terms or benefits which additional terms may (but need not) include a provision that annual Employer contributions may be made in an amount determined by the Superintendent to an account established for the employee under the District's §403(b) discretionary governmental plan maintained pursuant to Section 7, below, subject to any rules and restrictions imposed by federal law and regulations and the rules of the plan; if the Superintendent so desires, he may present to the Board the terms

of any such individualized contract without identifying the individual to be hired, and the Board shall determine whether to approve the contract on the basis of the contract terms and not on the basis of the identity of the person to be hired. Each employee shall be paid an annual salary initially established by the Superintendent in the letter of appointment or individual contract, and adjusted thereafter by the Superintendent in accordance with the provisions of these Rules and Regulations. Salaries shall be paid in twenty-six (26) equal bi-weekly installments, regardless of an employee's bi-weekly attendance. Adjustments to salaries shall be made on the basis of reported absences and the reason(s) therefor. All employees shall hold their positions and continue in their employment at the pleasure of the Superintendent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Education hereby amends sub-section C of Section 7 of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Education Relating to the Superintendent's Employee Group to read as follows:

C. The Superintendent is authorized to create and maintain a discretionary plan pursuant to § 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code for the exclusive benefit of those employees who are (i) direct appointees of the Superintendent, (ii) granted individual employment contracts which provide for their participation in such plan, and (iii) report directly to the Superintendent. As a term of an individual contract of employment of such direct reports, the Superintendent may, subject to approval by the Board pursuant to Section 6, above, provide that the District will make an Employer Nonelective Contribution to an account maintained for such employee under such plan, and may determine the amount of such employer contribution, not to exceed the amounts, or the percentage of base salary, permissible for such employee under federal law and regulations and the terms of the applicable plan. Such amount shall be specified in the contract of employment. The employee shall at all times have a fully (100%) vested interest in the contributions made on his or her behalf. The Superintendent is hereby authorized to take such steps as may be necessary to adopt one or more discretionary § 403(b) plans to provide said benefit in a manner consistent with federal law and regulations as they may be established or amended from time to time; and to administer such plan directly, or through a designee or contractor.
